Council of International Schools (CIS)

Last week Helena Sobulis and Julie Rimes from the Council of International Schools worked with staff, students and parents to assess the school's readiness to undertake re-accreditation as part of the re-accreditation cycle. The Preparatory Visit and Accreditation occurs every five years and our last reaccreditation was in 2012.

The Preparatory Visit is a rigorous process that began with staff completing self-evaluation tasks in term two, culminating in the team visit last week. The Council of International Schools looks at the following eight areas:

1. Purpose and Direction
2. Governance, Leadership and Ownership
3. The Curriculum
4. Teaching and Assessing for Learning
5. Student Learning and Wellbeing
6. Staffing
7. Premises and Physical Accommodation
8. Community and Home Partnerships

Helena and Julie thoroughly enjoyed their time learning about Caulfield Junior College and working with students, staff and parents. Helena and Julie, through their conversations, found:

- The school to be a positive learning environment
- CJC staff to be highly committed and engaged in working collaboratively
- Leadership is distributed and building staff capacity is a strength
- Children to be friendly, kind and proud of their school
- Integration of the curriculum with a strong intercultural focus is a strength of the school
- Community tone reflects a high rate of contentment
- Locking of the gates meets the standards and security of an international school

Helena and Julie will take the next six weeks to complete a written report listing the commendations and recommendations. The recommendations will need to be addressed, within the next eighteen months to two years to ensure re-accreditation is achieved.

Staff Recruitment

On Monday 4th September, Claire Roca, a new year 2 binome teacher, will commence at CJC. Claire is an experienced teacher who has worked in a bilingual school, French Catalan, in France. Audrey Lang will continue to work across the school for the remainder of the term. I thank Audrey for

all her work and ensuring a seamless transition for students and parents. Audrey will work with Claire as part of the transition program.

Trish Langford has replaced Sue Karantonis this term. I thank Trish for her work with students and families in year 1.

Andree Edwards has been providing additional assistance in the French Elective, in particular the junior school, this term. The additional assistance will continue in term 4.

School Grounds

Since term 2, Frank has been overseeing our school maintenance. He has done a wonderful job to ensure that the school grounds are clean, tidy and safe for children to enjoy. Frank has noticed continuous damage to our school grounds. For example: gates and fences being broken, eggs thrown at windows and buildings, school jumpers left in the yard set alight, broken windows, smashed glass bottles left in the yard, cigarette butts left in the yard, and damage to the track due to bicycles, scooters and skateboards.
