We've had 100 Days and it's the best days that we've spent

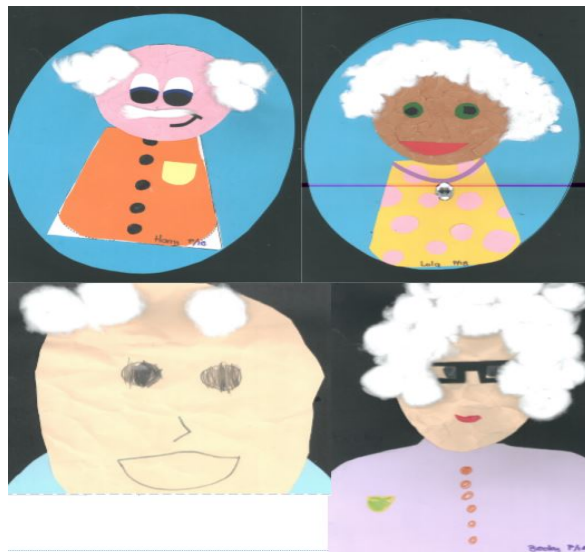

Dear Parents,

Please accept a huge thank you for the voluntary monetary contributions you have made to CJC. It makes a massive difference to all the kids, even if they don't see it from day to day.

So far we have received the following proceeds and will put them good use as follows:

ICT contributions totalling \$8000. This will be used as part of our Term 3 devices upgrade program.

Library Fund contributions of \$10,370. New books are being sourced to fill the space left by the library clean out (old and damaged books). Both English and French books are being considered.

School Maintenance Fund has benefitted from \$8,532 in contributions. This will go towards repair and replacement of the shade sails in the playgrounds, and for some maintenance work to be done on the oval and basketball court.

First Aid contributions of \$10,904 have been received as well. We are fortunate to have a school nurse, and this money goes towards continuing to provide this necessary service. The School Council has also agreed that there is sufficient funding to purchase a Defibrillator for the school. We are lucky to have a Councillor who has experience in this area and they are providing guidance on the best

We are proposing that we need a minimum of 60 books per language for this to work and ask all those interested in participating to let their Class Convenor know how many books they think they would like to swap.
