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We are nearing the end of the term and it has been amazing to see how the children are progressing as musicians!

The students in Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 are becoming confident at using solfège hand signs when singing (ie singing do, re, mi...).

The Year 3 and Year 4 students have been learning ukulele and it's been quite incredible to see many of the students pick up concepts quickly or apply them from other instrumental experiences. With continued perseverance these students should be able to play a four chord pop song by the end of the term.

In Years 5 and 6, the students are busily creating their remixes in preparation for the Amity Production in Term 3. Using Audacity, the students are learning to edit audio files to cleverly swap between songs they have chosen to perform to. It's an exciting time!

Finally, it's brilliant to see the whole school working together to choose and begin practising the songs that they will perform on the nights. The theme this year is "Amity", a word which is defined as friendship, harmony and mutual understanding between people and especially nations. This theme reflects one of our Caulfield Junior College's school values but also the unified nature of the school which began at the start of this year. We're really excited to keep working and preparing for our performances in September.

If September feels like an awfully long time away, the children in P/1/2 Singing, 3/4 Singing and 5/6 Singing have been learning songs in the style of folk and will be performing at the end of term assembly on June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 2pm. 5/6 Band and Glee Club will also be showing off their hard work over the semester. ### **Bikes and Scooters**

All bikes and scooters need to be kept in the cage at the rear of the school throughout the school day. This is to prevent children from playing with them during school hours, and to prevent theft. The storage cage will be unlocked between 8:45 and 9am, then again between 3:30 and 3:45pm. If a child is attending school activities outside of these times (e.g. Camp Australia, Hebrew, after school activities), they may leave their bikes and scooters neatly under the library stairs ONLY at these times. This means that children attending before-school activities will need to move their bikes and scooters to the storage cage at 8:45, and at 3:30 they may be collected and placed under the library stairs for those attending after-school activities. If your child rides a bike or scooter to school, please speak with them to ensure they understand this requirement.

### EXCURSION/INCURSION PAYMENTS AND PERMISSION FORMS

Your child will participate in many excursions and incursions throughout their time at Caulfield Junior College. Excursions and incursions are designed to stimulate and motivate learning and are a

highlight for many students. Parent volunteers are often required to assist on excursions and requests are made via the classroom teacher.

The cost of the extra-curriculum Excursions and Incursions that occur during the year are covered by the Key Experiences Levy- most families pay this in full. On some occasions other activities are offered which require separate payment. If you receive an Excursion or Incursion Permission slip that has a payment slip attached, it means that payment is required at the Office before your child can attend or participate. As always if you are experiencing financial difficulty please contact the Office BEFORE the event.

Standardised 'Permission Notification Reports' are sent home to parents when their child is to attend an incursion or excursion. The notes include details of the excursion/incursion including date/s, destination, transport method, adult responsible and the cost. This note also includes personalised student details – please ensure that all the details are current.

Parents are required to sign the 'Permission Notification Report' and include an emergency contact number for the particular excursion/incursion to which the note relates (the 'Permission Notification Reports' must be taken by the class teacher on the excursion).

'Permission Notification Reports' and relevant payment must be returned by the due date of the excursion/incursion. **THE RETURN DATE IS STRICTLY ONE WEEK PRIOR** to the event, as this is generally when we need to confirm numbers. If a signed permission slip or payment is not received by the return date, your child cannot attend or participate. Parents will be notified by the classroom teacher in this instance.

Students must be dressed in full school uniform when attending excursions. Students are seen as ambassadors for our school and dressing neatly reflects a sense of pride as well as making it easier to identify our students.

## **NO DOGS ALLOWED**

Please be advised that as of Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June it will not be permissible for dogs to be on the school grounds at any time – including after hours and weekends.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding.
