From our School Leadership Team

Meeting our community has been an important aspect of my new appointment. The CJC community is diverse, passionate and committed to the improvement of our school. Thank you for the warm welcomes, the many visits and the steady stream of correspondence that arrives on my desk. Being in classrooms and meeting my students has been a priority and has allowed me to discover the true culture of our school and see the quality of our staff and students first hand.

This week we have met with Regional staff to outline the work undertaken across the school in the curriculum program and senior staff were able to celebrate and acknowledge the high levels of engagement and achievement during 2017. We have commenced planning for the 2018 school year and our focus since my arrival has been around staffing, recruitment of staff and the grade structures for next year.

All this work is complex and has many pieces that need consideration, funding allocations and resourcing attached. As we confirm details and class structures we will communicate this important work to our community. At School Council next week I am presenting some proposed structures for classroom allocations, a staffing plan and will also seek advice and direction around some of the ongoing issues in our school community.

Our local member of Parliament, Mr. David Southwick visited our school today and spoke eloquently around the meaning of Remembrance Day. He also presented the school with a book from the Caulfield Historical Society that will be added to our Library collection. He also spent time in my office and it was great opportunity to reacquaint with him and share my views on a range of issues.

My regular meetings with our School Council President, Stephen Loyer have ensured I am updated about issues and have the opportunity to clarify my ideas and seek his advice.

This week has been a terrific week and I look forward to a great weekend.

Curriculum Day – What did we work on?

Our Curriculum Day last Monday had a focus on three areas:

- Assessment in Speaking and Listening
 - How do our students perform in Speaking and Listening?
 - Does this data correlate with our Reading and Viewing and Writing data?
 - How can we ensure our assessments accurately reflect the abilities of our students?
- Our 2017-18 Transition Program
 - How do we excite our students about their next year level?
 - How do we ensure our students feel safe and secure about moving to their next year level?
 - What will our 2017-18 transition program look like?
- Collaborative Team Planning
 - Curriculum and assessment planning for the remainder of 2017.

We thank our teachers for their professionalism across the day and for the hard work they did to ensure we continue to provide our students with a high quality teaching and learning program.

New Zealand Exchange

Twelve of our Years 5 and 6 students, along with Caroline Pommier, Vincent Berraud and Tom Lewis, are currently visiting our sister-school at Kenakena. The group departed on Wednesday, attended their first day at the school yesterday and were due to go on a boat trip today.

Remembrance Day Assembly

Our local member of parliament, David Southwick, spoke about Remembrance Day and the particular significance to the local area and to our school, which was used as a hospital during World War I. Mr. Southwick also presented the school with the book *A Soldier Lived in my House: A WWI History of Caulfield*. We will proudly house this book in our library and invite you to come in and take a look.

A special thanks to Cat Wilson for organising Mr. Southwick's visit and working with the student leaders to host an event that honoured and respected the significance of the day.

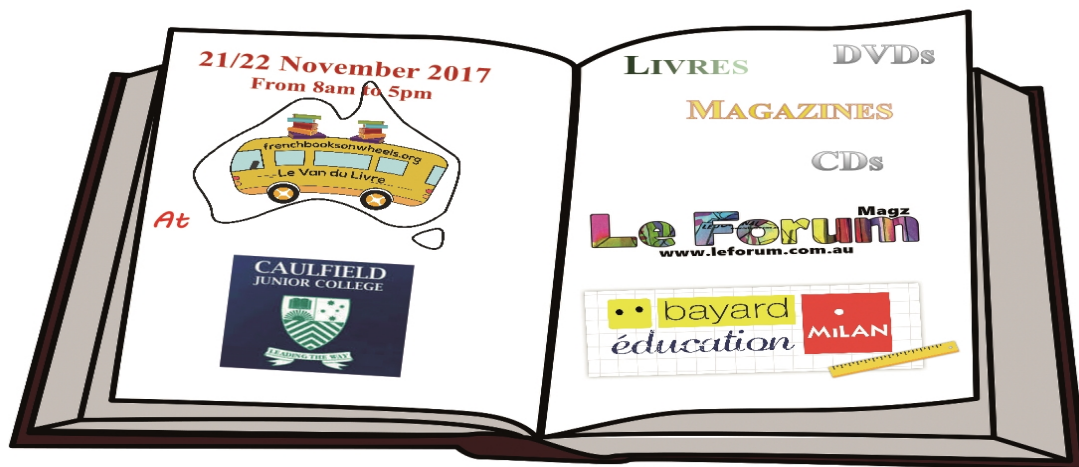
