From our School Leadership Team,

The weather this week has created some interesting situations for us and the adage about changing Melbourne weather has certainly been the case over the last few days.

I continue to meet with families and would like to again express my thanks to those who have introduced themselves and welcomed me to CJC.

At our most recent School Council meeting I was able to give the members a first look at the proposed staffing and class structures for the coming school year. Whilst staff allocation, structures and programs are key roles for the principal and school leaders to develop, it is also important that Council are aware of what is proposed. We are completing the associated staffing arrangements and preparing budgets to support this direction and we will communicate this to our community once all aspects of this work are confirmed.

Council also approved that the January 29th 2018, January 30th and January 31st will be curriculum days for staff development, planning and emergency management training. Students will commence on February 1st 2018. Please mark these days in your calendars and adjust your arrangements accordingly.

Each term all principals are required to attend area forums chaired by our Senior Regional staff. On Wednesday we worked on planning the 2018 Annual Implementation Plans (AIP), looked at implications and issues around the recently approved Victorian Government Services Agreement (VGSA) and the impact on school finances, HR and employment arrangements. The final session focussed on wellbeing of Principal class people and strategies in place to support Principal's so they can take on the challenges of operating schools with confidence.

On Wednesday evening I watched a number of our students receive awards at the 2017 Berthe Mouchette Competition. Congratulations to our students for their efforts and representing our school in this prestigious competition.

Student Leadership

Next week our Years 4 and 5 students will be presenting speeches for student leadership roles in 2018. This is an opportunity for students to display their leadership skills in front of their peers, who will collaborate with teachers in electing the 2018 leaders. Students and teachers, as well as members of the school leadership team, will attend and we look forward to hearing about the exciting initiatives that our future leaders are looking to implement.

AEFE Professional Development

Claire Skrabal and Isabelle Brinkmann will be on a Professional Development Training abroad next week. Being a partner of the AEFE means that our teachers can apply for PD training in the Asia Pacific AEFE zone. This year, Claire will go to Thailand for a Web Radio PD and Isabelle will attend a PD on Mathematics for Cycle 3 in Tokyo. We are looking forward to them sharing their learning when they come back. Both teachers will be replaced with French speaking teachers to ensure effective learning continues while they are away.

Transition

Next Wednesday we will begin our whole-school transition program. This includes welcoming our new group of 2018 preps into the school and all other students moving to their new year level for the morning. This is a great opportunity for students to work in a different area of the school, meet new friends and spend time with other teachers. Each session will run for approximately one-hour over the next three weeks and will culminate with a whole-school orientation day, where students will meet their 2018 class and teacher/s, on Tuesday 12th December.

Claudie Ricci visit

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, we would like to inform you that Claudie Ricci, the French Inspector, will be at CJC from the 27th to the 29th of November for her annual visit. She will be working with teachers, students and the leadership team. Her observation class will be focused on Prep and Grade 1 to work on the articulation of reading and writing in a bilingual setting. She will also work with Grade 5 and 6 teachers to ensure a good preparation for High School. In parallel, Claudie will also meet with Simon Hamilton, our Regional Executive Director from the DET. Bertrand Pous, our COCAC, will take part in this meeting as well. In addition, we have invited School Council members and the French Elective Subcommittee members to meet with Claudie. We are looking forward to her visit!

Class Placement

Our teachers have begun planning the class placement process for 2018. Students will have the opportunity to nominate five of their peers who they work well with to give their teachers guidance in constructing the new classes. Parents also had the opportunity to write to the leadership team with further information regarding specific educational needs for their child/ren and we thank you for your input.

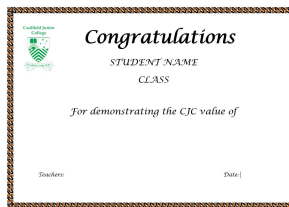

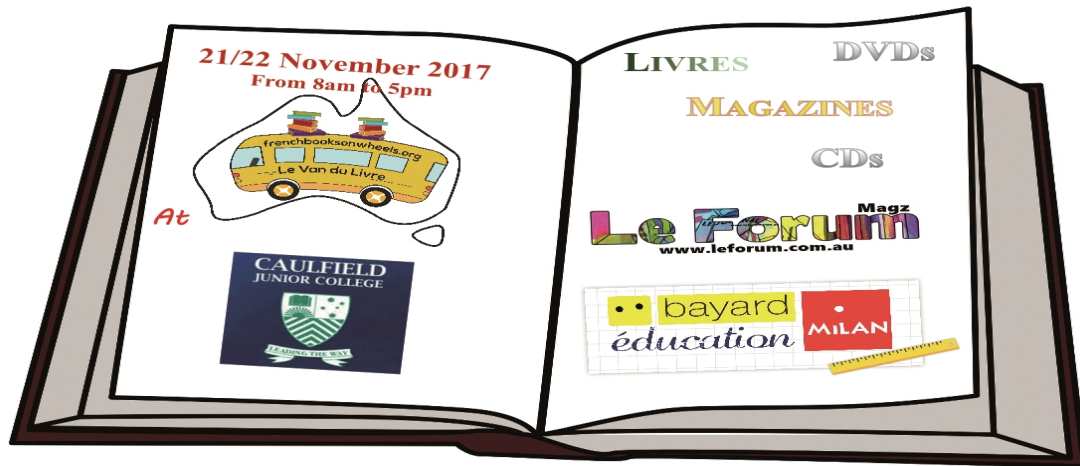


Books on Wheels - French Book Fair
