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## From Our School Leadership Team,

Our school has proudly commemorated ANZAC Day in a variety of ways this week. Our school leaders joined leaders from other schools last Friday in a commemoration at The Shrine of Remembrance. We led a service at Caulfield Park with Mr. David Southwick MP and were joined by representatives from St. Aloysius Primary School and Gardenvale Primary School on Tuesday. On Tuesday night, Caroline and I attended an event hosted by Honorary Consul-General Mrs. Myriam Boisbouvier-Wylie, commemorating 100 years of friendship between Melbourne and Villers-Bretonneux. Amongst the guests were DET Regional Director Stephen Gniel, with whom we discussed both this special event and the exciting progress that we are making at our school.

Our students in Years 3 and 5 are currently preparing for the upcoming NAPLAN tests. Our teachers are delivering a program that ensures students are both familiar with the content they may be presented with, as well as the format for testing. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your classroom teacher.

The safety, health and wellbeing of our students is always paramount in our mind. In addition, I would like to reinforce a couple of key safety messages:

- Supervision in the yard does not begin until 8:45am. Please ensure you bring your child/ren to school after this time, unless they are attending a before school program.
- The school carpark is not for pedestrians. Please ensure you use the appropriate gates and footpaths around the school.
- Our school day concludes at 3:30; please ensure you arrive at 3:30 to collect your child/ren. Supervision in the yard concludes at 3:45.
- If your child/ren walks or rides to school, please ensure they understand road rules and particularly the safe crossing of roads. It can be a good idea to practise your trip to school together on the weekends.

Congratulations to those who were successful nominations for executive positions and convenors of sub-committees and a warm welcome to our new members. The remit of a School Council is to support the strategic direction of the school and I look forward to working closely with the group to ensure the best possible outcomes for both our students and our school. All Staff at Caulfield Junior College work very hard to cater for every individual's wellbeing situations by being constantly aware of their current needs. We aim to provide stimulated learning situations where each student's learning styles and modes

of learning are acknowledged and where each student is able to feel happy, safe and accepted for who they are. I have been busy enjoying my new role in Wellbeing and been building my relationships with many students. My office is located in the Junior School building. Students come to me for lots of different reasons.

We believe in healthy body, healthy mind so in conjunction with Gemma (PE teacher) we will be sharing information in the newsletter on some of the topics that we discuss at school in our Health lessons with Gemma and some discussion points you may like to talk to your child at home about eg. Conflict resolution, anger management techniques and positive/negative mindsets.






