Staff Absence - Teacher Replacement Process

I am aware that some parents become concerned when their child's teacher is absent from school and parents may wonder, 'What is the school's process for managing staff absence?'

There are different types of leave staff can take, the two I will talk about are 'known absence' and 'emergency absence'. Known absence (of more than one day) occurs in a school, where absence is usually planned for well ahead of time. For this type of absence, teachers are replaced for the duration of the absence, from the first day of leave until the staff member returns to school.

'Emergency absences' are absences where notification of an absence is not known in advance and finding suitable teachers to replace the teacher is not always possible at such short notice. (You may remember last year, there were several times we could not find suitable replacement teachers). For this type of absence, classes are split within the year on the first day of the absence and a replacement teacher is employed for the remainder of the absence.

Within schools, clear processes and a consistent approach is important to effective daily organisation. Previously we had two different systems in place to replace teachers and with all our work on building unity within our school two systems are disruptive and divisive. As one school we need one policy on how to manage staff absence.

This term, the Policy and Development subcommittee of School Council will begin to write a policy outlining the teacher replacement process. The Policy and Development subcommittee are always looking for new members. If you are interested in becoming involved and are interested in developing policy, please contact Rohan Cooper, our assistant principal and convenor of the committee.

I understand that some parents may be nervous about our teacher replacement process. I am writing to reassure you that we have a carefully considered policy regarding teacher replacement and that our priority at CJC is always the children and what is in their best interests.

Please remember that Rohan, Caroline and I are always available to meet should you need any clarification or support.
